

Dr. Daniel Storer



Dr. Daniel Storer graduated from Williamsburg High School in 1963. He received his doctor of medicine from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine in 1971. Dr. Storer served two 2 years as a captain and general medical officer in the United States Air Force at Chanute Air Force base in Rantoul, Illinois. As a professor of clinical emergency medicine at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine, Dr. Storer was instrumental in founding University Air Care and became its medical director in 1984. Storer was a medical commander and directed EMS personnel at the Beverly Hills Supper Club in 1977 and the Who concert disaster at Riverfront Coliseum in 1979. Nationally, Dr. Storer served as a member, and eventually chairman, of Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs for the EMT-Paramedic. He was devoted his entire career to advancing the delivery of emergency medical. Dr. Daniel Storer passed away September 21, 2004.

Mr. David Carter



David Carter graduated Williamsburg High School in 1973. He was inducted into the Clermont County Sports Hall of Fame in 2002 and Williamsburg Sports Hall of Fame in 2007. David received his MBA in Management from Xavier University in 1996 with a GPA of 4.0. He then obtained his Juris Doctorate in 1991 from Salmon P. Chase School of Law, graduating Magna Cum Laude and third in his class. David helped to start VISTA, a tax program which assists seniors and low income individuals with tax preparations. He then became Chief Financial Officer of the U.S. Operations at Norpax Security Printers, Inc. He is also a licensed CPA in addition to being an attorney. David is also licensed to practice before the United States Tax Court. From 1995-2012, he left the large law firm to work as a Clermont County Assistant Prosecutor in the civil divisions and maintain a private practice with the law firm Nichols, Speidel and Nichols. David served on the Williamsburg Local School Board for 8 years and was Vice President in 1995. He was President of the Rotary for 2 years and president of the Williamsburg Athletic Boosters for 4 years. Currently, David Carter maintains a private law and accounting practice in Batavia.

Dr. Deborah Maham-Deepe



Dr. Deborah Maham-Deepe graduated from Williamsburg High School in 1969 as the Valedictorian. She attended the University of Cincinnati and graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1972. She then attended the University of Cincinnati Medical School and graduated in 1976. Dr. Maham-Deepe married George S. Deepe, Jr. She then established an internal medical practice in Williamsburg. Drs. Deepe had two children, Matt and Erin. Dr. Maham-Deepe developed breast cancer in the 1980's. She continued to practice medicine while she recovered. Dr. Maham-Deepe then attended Law School at the University of Cincinnati, graduated in 1992, and passed the bar exam shortly thereafter. In the early 1990's she was diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer and restarted chemotherapy. Despite the progression of the cancer, and the side effects of the chemotherapy, her resolve was never dampened. She ultimately passed away from breast cancer on March 18, 1995.

Bill graduated at the top of his class from Williamsburg High School in 1949. He received his M.D degree from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine in 1956. After his residence in 1959, he served as a medical officer in the Navy at the U.S. Naval Hospital Beaufort in South Carolina. In 1964, Bill left active duty in the Navy for private practice in Seattle, Washington where he opened a private practice of pediatrics. At the same time he served in the U.S. Naval Reserve as a submarine medical officer. He completed 21 years of naval service and retired at the rank of captain. He was married in 1956 and had four sons, one of which competed on the U.S. Rowing team in the 1984 Olympic Games and received a silver medal. In 2010, he married Williamsburg graduate Peg Fisher.
